#### TRANSFER OF YERKES OWNERSHIP ANNOUNCED

The University of Chicago and the Yerkes Future Foundation (YFF) have announced an agreement in principle for transfer of ownership of Yerkes Observatory and related property in Williams Bay to YFF. "Over the next several months, both organizations will be closely working on all aspects of the proposed transfer," according to a statement released by both parties.

The university's announcement in March 2018 to cease operations at Yerkes prompted the formation of YFF, a nonprofit group, led by Williams Bay resident Dianna Colman, with a mission to reopen the observatory to the public.

When reached for comment, Colman stated, "The Yerkes Future Foundation plans on preserving the iconic structure, honoring its history and legacy, and reopening the site to visitors, scientists, astronomers, educators and students. We're very excited about the future, but we recognize there is much to do to ensure the observatory lasts for many generations."

Since Oct. 1, 2018, when the observatory closed to the public, students and faculty in the University of Chicago's Department of Astronomy and Astrophysics have continued to do educational and research work there. Upon completion of the transfer to YFF, the university will end its involvement with the observatory, the announcement stated.

#### CLINIC TO EXPAND **DENTAL SERVICES**

Open Arms Free Clinic (OAFC) in Elkhorn is closing in on its fundraising goal of \$250,000, the amount needed to purchase an adjacent building and expand its dental services to hundreds of new patients.

According to Executive Director Sara Nichols, OAFC receives about 10 calls a day from Walworth County residents seeking dental care, a service it started offering on a limited basis in 2015.

OAFC provides medical and supportive care services to local residents who are uninsured or underinsured and live in a household with an income at or below 200% of the federal poverty level. The volunteer-driven organization received a dental grant in 2017, which allowed them to hire paid staff to assist their dental personnel. In 2018, OAFC began accepting Medicaid for children who require access to dental care.

The building adjacent to OAFC currently houses Family Dental Arts, which is moving its practice and paving the way for Open Arms to create a new six-chair dental suite. An affiliation agreement is in process with Marquette Dental School, and

donated equipment is ready to move in, according to Nichols.

"Every five years the county does a community health improvement plan, and access to dental care is continually in the top five needs," Nichols says. "This will allow us to provide free dental care to qualified adults and children under one roof."

Nichols says Open Arms plans to announce its completed fundraising efforts during its annual Birthday Gala on Dec. 6, which will mark OAFC's seventh year of operation. The dental clinic opening date could be as early as January, added Nichols. For information, visit openarmsfreeclinic.org.

## WATER SAFETY PATROL BOOK UNVEILED

Almost 100 years after Simeon B. Chapin founded the Geneva Lake Water Safety Patrol, about 75 people gathered in mid-October at his former Lake Geneva home to celebrate the organization's milestone anniversary.

The gathering marked the formal launch of the newly released title "Running the Reds," a book documenting the nonprofit's history dating back to 1920. The Safety Patrol's 100 Committee enlisted former patrol member Anne Morrissy to write the book and chose Nei-Turner Media Group, Inc. to design it.

"The Water Safety Patrol is a one-of-a-kind organization," according to Operations Director Ted Pankau. "It's very unique, and it's kind of hard to explain to

people exactly what we are, where we come from and how we got to where we are today. This book does an excellent job of kind of putting that together in a story with pictures. Anne did a phenomenal job showing who we are and how important we are to the community."

Kelly Otzen, 100 Committee chairwoman, says many former patrollers attended the launch party and "their reaction to the book was super special." ... Most importantly, the book highlights the number of lives the Water Safety Patrol has saved as it fulfills its role in keeping Lake Geneva safe," she adds.





## ICE CASTLES MOVES TO GENEVA NATIONAL

Lake Geneva will again be transformed into a magical winter wonderland as Ice Castles, LLC returns with a larger and more interactive attraction.

Although the company's first appearance on Lake Geneva's Riviera Beach last year drew thousands, Ice Castles Marketing Director Melissa Smuzynski says the new location at Geneva National Resort & Club will allow for more space to expand the icy paradise with additional slides, crawl spaces, slot cannons and more. "Ultimately, what we can create is entirely dependent on Mother Nature," Smuzynski says. "Sometimes she's really nice to us and allows us to build something really grand, and other times she can be a little more challenging to work with."

Leslie Johnson, vice president of sales and marketing at Geneva National, says the ice castle attraction will be located on the driving range near the clubhouse. The gated community plans to bring in additional security during the heavy traffic times, especially for weekends and holidays.

"We're very excited that they wanted us to be their location this year," Johnson says. "We think the backdrop we have against Lake Como will be beautiful, and the ability for people to get in and out will be better."

Smuzynski expects the ice castle to take up about an acre of land, or about double the size of last year's, meaning it should be able to accommodate more guests at once.

Guests are encouraged to reserve a time slot online at icecastles.com/lake-geneva. Weather permitting, the attraction is scheduled to open in early January.

# A TRANSFORMATIVE PRESENCE

## Emily Kornak's vision for the Lake Geneva Public Library is ever-evolving, ensuring this community resource stays relevant

The view from her office is stunning. Two massive floor-to-ceiling windows look out on Geneva Lake. From there she can watch seasons change and people strolling the Shore Path awash in lake views and daydreams.

Anyone else would be so entranced by the view to the point of distraction. Not Emily Kornak, director of the Lake Geneva Public Library.

"I'm so busy I don't even have a chance to enjoy it," Kornak says with a smile. She speaks with a quick, upbeat lilt. The speed of her cadence is in line with the pace at which she works.

Yes, Kornak has heard people say she has the best office in Lake Geneva because of its view. But she would rather give up that view and give it to library patrons.

Her vision, and that of the library board, is to expand the library's already expansive lake views that make it so attractive. The board is currently contemplating a number of upgrades which include repurposing the director's office into a place where others can admire the view.

Those changes would be in line with what James Dresser had in mind when he designed the library in 1954. Dresser was a protégé of Frank Lloyd Wright, whose Prairie style architecture emphasized bringing the outside in as the library's panoramic windows do. The hope is to incorporate that philosophy with today's needs — which is actually akin to the form-follows-function mantra Wright and his disciples championed.

But it's a far cry from 1894 when Mary Sturges deeded her small cottage and the land around it to the city to be used as a library and park in perpetuity.

Today, people surf the internet for information and order books via websites like Amazon and Barnes & Noble — conveniences Mary Sturges couldn't begin to imagine. And reference desks, once staples of libraries, are nearly as useless as card catalogs.

#### REINVENTING AND REIMAGINING

Adapting to new times, however, is the key to the future, explains Kornak. "My vision for the future of libraries keeps changing as I see more and more innovation from libraries around the country and around the world," she says.

Since Kornak took over as director three years ago, the library has increased programming and expanded its network with other libraries to provide access to more than a million items, which can be delivered nearly as quickly as they can by Amazon.

People can also check out items from the library that have nothing to do with books: Wi-Fi hotspots, cake pans, portable CD and DVD players, a metal detector, cassette converter, iPad with preloaded movies, Playaway audiobooks (and audio cables to connect them in your car), thumb pianos, a mini steel drum, ukuleles, bocce ball sets, American Girl dolls and birdwatching kits.

"It's not just about technology," Kornak says, "it's also about community, connections, and working and learning and the space where all of this can take place." The library was one of the first to eliminate fines for most overdue materials and has added Sunday hours in the winter and spring. The vision is for the library to evolve into a community gathering place.

Making the library more popular is especially important as its funding comes from the county and is based on the number of items checked out. The city's lack of free parking puts it at a disadvantage with other libraries in the county.

"I think libraries are still in their era of transformation where what we do is shaped both by staff anticipating community needs and the community telling us what they want," Kornak says.

The people who work in libraries have changed, too, from the days when the stereotype of the librarian was someone who "shushed" patrons. Now, at the Lake Geneva Public Library, you're likely to be greeted with an inviting smile and a "How can I help you?"

"Over the past couple of years, we have made a concerted effort to focus on customer service, library programs and events, and our service offerings to patrons in general," Kornak explains.

She's been pleased with the reaction from patrons who have appreciated the changes, but she wishes more people would visit. Free library cards and a seamless checkout process make the library one of today's best bargains.

"This is such a valued community resource, and the love of reading and learning that we see every day in our regular visitors makes my librarian heart very happy," she says. "But I also think there are a lot of people who either have forgotten or don't realize the value of using the library, and there is a challenge for us in reaching those people to let them know that this is their library, and that we're here for everyone."

#### HER JOURNEY TO LAKE GENEVA

Kornak's life journey could be a book in itself. She was born in South Korea and was adopted by an American family before her first birthday. She grew up outside of West Bend where she frequented the West Bend Public Library and got her first taste of the library experience.

"I remember story times there and my favorite children's librarian," she says. "She was quite a storyteller."

Her favorite books from childhood? The "Anne of Green Gables" books, the "Black Stallion" series, "Where the Red Fern Grows," "The Wind in the Willows" and "Charlotte's Web."

"My parents are readers. I used to borrow my mom's library books when I wanted



something new to read, and my dad is a collector of books."

She had an early connection to Lake Geneva because she had extended family that lived in the area. "I have some early memories of visiting Lake Geneva over holidays and other occasions to see my grandparents," she says. "The lake is stunning, the downtown is charming, the people are warm and friendly — what's not to love?"

Kornak didn't start out to become a librarian. She studied international relations at UW-Madison in hopes of working for the United Nations. "I found political science fascinating, and the added international aspect even more so. I still do, but working for the UN is no longer on my list of career goals."

Her first job after college was with the American Chamber of Commerce in Frankfurt, Germany. Later, she worked in marketing for a manufacturer of ultrasonic welding machinery, at Walgreens headquarters and for a stainless-steel manufacturer. "The companies I worked for tended to have fast-paced, demanding environments. I liked that aspect," she says. "I don't mind pressure and deadlines, and there's a lot of both [in the library]."

She started wanting to do something where she could actually help people directly. "Libraries had never occurred to me," she says, "but when I started considering moving back into non-profits, suddenly public libraries popped up on my radar and I thought, yes — this! This is what I'd like to try. I've never looked back."

Her first library job was at the Barrington Area Library in Barrington, Illinois, where she started part time as a library assistant. She worked there while she got her master's degree in library and information science from UW-Milwaukee. As soon as she finished graduate school, a full-time position as a librarian opened up at Barrington and she became their first Business Liaison Librarian. After that she worked at the Waukesha Public



Lake Geneva resident and son of immigrants,
Armen Avedisian was driven to achieve
success and lead the efforts to restore our
nation's symbols of freedom

WHAT DO LAKE GENEVA and the Statue of Liberty have in common? Armen Avedisian, a first-generation Armenian-American, who paved thousands of miles of roadway in Illinois, owned a bank in Lake Geneva, and was tapped by President Ronald Reagan to chair the commission for the restoration and

preservation of the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island.

A successful entrepreneur and longtime summer resident on Geneva Lake's south shore, Avedisian's quarries and patents made him millions. He retired at 49, but not really. When Citizens National Bank in his beloved Lake Geneva became available in 1980, he purchased it. Today, his legacy is an enduring testament to the power of the immigrant story — a story of first-generation Americans, who realize their grandest fortune is the freedom to succeed or fail as spectacularly as they wish.

For Avedisian, the choice was always clear: He would succeed.

"He had a burning desire to be an entrepreneur," said his son, Guy Avedisian, in a Nov. 23, 2000, Chicago Tribune obituary about his father. "He believed very strongly in someone owning a business. He thought that one of the greatest things about this country was to be an individual entrepreneur."

Committed to the American dream, owning a bank was a labor of love for Avedisian, says Lake Geneva resident Roger O'Neill, a longtime friend of Avdesian and his wife, Dorothy. "He was good for the town because he had access to the local businessmen, and he knew them, and he knew the area and he knew what they were facing," says O'Neill.

Today his children recall a father for whom money was not the greatest treasure.

"He'd update his resume and bio frequently, and one-third of it was dedicated to his kids. He had a lot of pride in his kids," recalls son Vann, a private equity consultant. "He was very accomplished in business and civics, and yet, his children were front and center."

#### FROM HUMBLE BEGINNINGS

That his own three children were front and center may have been as much parental instinct as it was gratitude for the chance to raise them on free soil. His own parents, and his first wife Dorothy Donian's parents, came to America as refugees. Fleeing the Armenian genocide, the systematic slaughter of as many as 1.5 million Armenians by the Turks of the Ottoman Empire, their escapes were harrowing.

"I don't know much about the journey of my father's father here to the U.S., but my father's mother, I know survived the Armenian genocide. Her family was all killed. She got diphtheria and was in Aleppo in an orphanage. Her picture appeared in an advertisement in a magazine in Detroit, for the Detroit area, and a relative saw her photo, and it was asking for money, of course, and they saw her, and recognized her, and that's how she came to the U.S," explains daugher, Donna, who resides in Portland today.

What role do the Avedisian children think their grandparents' experiences in the genocide played in their father's life? "We're all products of our parents and their experiences," reflects Vann. "And it's hard to really know, when you escape something like that, how it would shape you. My guess is that it was pretty important for Dad to work hard and be studious and be goal-oriented, which he was."

#### THE FIRST GENERATION

Armen Avedisian was a first-generation American, who grew up in Elmhurst, Illinois. His immigrant father was a civil engineer with the State of Illinois. Avedisian received an engineering degree in 1949 from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Following his graduation, he worked as an asphalt and paving superintendent. Just a few years later, he was working for a rival firm as their vice president. Before he was 30, he had his own company, Lincoln Stone Quarry Inc. in Joliet.

n 1952, he would marry his first wife, Dorothy Donian. (They divorced in 1996.) By the late 1950s, Avedisian owned his own road construction company. By 1976, he was the chairman of the board, chief executive officer, and sole stockholder of Avedisian Industries, a holding of six corporations centered in the quarrying and heavy construction industries. In 1979 he sold his companies, and a crucial patent to Commonwealth Edison. Not even a year later, though, he needed something to do. Always on the prowl for a good investment, Avedisian, also a globally renowned backgammon player, purchased Citizens National Bank in Lake Geneva and its \$25 million in assets.

"He was very driven," recalls Donna. "Once he retired from the business of road building and owning quarries and mining limestone, he got advice from a member of the Chicago business community that he shouldn't retire and should look into some options. Suggestions were made on what to look at, and they heard of the bank in Lake Geneva being for sale."

Helping other entrepreneurs also appealed to him. In a 1986 *Lake Geneva Regional News* story, a friend offered this on Avedisian's motives for banking: "He wanted to help people," recalled the friend, John Elasarian, a Lake Geneva restaurant

manager. "When he was young and had ambitious ideas, he went to banks to borrow money, and in many cases, he was turned down."

#### PRESERVING LADY LIBERTY

Patriotism also appealed to Avedisian, and in 1982 the lifelong Republican had been appointed by President Reagan to the Statue of Liberty-Ellis Island Centennial Commission and Foundation. The commission's aim was to restore and protect the aging statue and raise funds to preserve Ellis Island. On his first visit to Ellis Island, according to press reports, he simply stood silently in the deteriorating building, wondering what his "young, bewildered" immigrant parents "who could not speak English," thought as they were processed in this very space.

As a committee member, Avedisian was taking a week off from his bank each month to fly to New York and apply what the *Chicago Tribune* dubbed "liberal elbow grease" to the fundraising effort.






Why not have the government pay for the restoration? "We wanted it to be a private endeavor to build patriotism around the country and deepen appreciation for what the statue and America are all about," explained Avedisian in a June 20, 1985 story with the *Lake Geneva Regional News*.

His children say their father was as thrilled with the buckets full of change from school children as he was with the six-figure donations from titans of industry. In 1986, President Reagan named Avedisian to head the commission replacing Chrysler Corporation Chairman Lee Iacocca.

While Armen Avedisian raised funds to restore the Statue of Liberty, his wife, Dorothy Donian Avedisian, raised funds to bring the musical arts to Lake Geneva area schools. A classically trained opera singer, she was one of the cofounders of the Lake Geneva Floating Opera. The Avedisians were major benefactors of the Lyric Opera in Chicago and brought world-renowned opera to Lake Geneva one night a summer aboard The Lady of the Lake. Ticket prices were a then-steep \$100 or more, but proceeds gave area children access to touring opera companies.

"It was beautiful," says Sue Larkin, a longtime neighbor and friend of the Avedisians. "It was a beautiful event, and Dorothy was a singer herself and loved the arts. All of the arts."

"Why do we want to give opera to children?" she was asked in a June 18, 1998 Lake Geneva Regional News story. "Because opera has everything. We all need creative escapes to keep our minds and souls and bodies intact, and this is one of those escapes."

The Floating Opera had a successful run for over two decades. Today, Dorothy Avedisian is in her 90s, and resides in Illinois. For years, her family summered in Lake Geneva. The Samuel Donian Wetlands Preserve, between West Main and Center streets, was donated for public use by her family and named for her father, who also escaped the Armenian genocide as a stowaway on a ship.

Fundraising efforts netted over \$256 million dollars from individuals, schools, civic groups and private companies, and corporate sponsors. Reagan shared his gratitude in this letter to Avedisian:

"The work of the commission has exceeded our fondest expectations. As a member of the commission since 1982 and its chairman for the past year and a half, you've done yeoman's work ... The unprecedented outpouring of affection and generosity on the part of the American people in response to this historic undertaking will always remain a highlight of my years as president. Again, thank you for giving of your time and talents. Your dedication over the years has been a source of inspiration to me and the American people."

## THE SECOND GENERATION REFLECTS

Only two generations removed from genocide, the Avedisian children are keenly aware of how divided America is today. What do they think their father, a conservative Republican, would make of that division? "I don't think he would have a very positive view on the nationalistic bent that seems to exist now," says

Vann. "He was very patriotic, but not a nationalist. He knew (nationalism) fuels genocide."

Donna agrees. "He aligned with what would favor hard work and perseverance, and what would enable entrepreneurs to be entrepreneurs. I think he would be in favor of some commonsense immigration policies," she reflects. "And he knew what his parents went through in the Armenian genocide."

Of course, we can't ask Avedisian what his thoughts would be about today's political climate. Gone for 19 years, we can only speculate.

However, we get a sense that this actual bridge builder was, in every sense of the word, a uniter. Giving an address to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Armenian

Apostolic Church in America at Ellis Island in 1998, he offered these words:

"Some years ago, I was privileged to be part of the restoration of Lady Liberty and Ellis Island. During the course of that labor of love, we learned that the Lady was much more than just metal plates supported by an iron frame. This great hall was much more than mere bricks and mortar. And, the people who entered America through these portals represented much more than flesh, blood and bone. These twin icons, and the people drawn to them, were imbued with an indomitable spirit and sense of hope. Not mere symbols, they were the embodiment of humanity's unwillingness to succumb to oppression and hatred. They stood in stark counterpoint to the evil that has plagued mankind since the beginning of time." 🛦



As a result of the show, the community gained the attention of artist Cecile Johnson who was commissioned by Ford Motor Company in 1958 to create six watercolor paintings illustrating a small town to accompany an article in their monthly publication, the *Ford Times*. Later, a major publishing house used five of the six paintings for Christmas cards, distributing them nationwide and further bolstering Elkhorn's image as an idyllic Midwestern town.







**EVERY WINTER, THE BUS ARRIVES FROM CHICAGO** full of kids who are visiting The Mountain Top at Grand Geneva for the first time. That's how Chad Hart, director of Ski Area Operations at Grand Geneva Resort, describes the moment when the participants of Burton Snowboards' Chill Foundation take their first steps onto the snow.

t is absolutely amazing to see the reaction of the youth every year when they arrive at the ski area," Hart says.

Based in Burlington, Vermont, the Chill Foundation chose to headquarter their Midwest programming at Grand Geneva Resort, where this season they plan to host over 100 kids ranging in age from 10 to 18. In a sixweek period in January and February, 40-50 kids at a time will come for threehour, twice-weekly sessions. They'll learn to snowboard with the best of them and learn a lot about themselves in the process.

#### AN IMPACTFUL PROGRAM

The Chill Foundation was started in 1995 by Jake and Donna Carpenter, the founders of Burton Snowboards. "Youth largely drove the growth of snowboarding and Burton, and they wanted to have a way to give back and provide opportunities for all kids to participate," says Alex Bornstein, executive director of the Chill Foundation.

The nonprofit foundation has taught 25,000 participants to snowboard, but it's not just about hitting the slopes. The program, with national and international sites, centers around a value-driven curriculum made up of experiential learning activities, reflection and discussion while paired with boardsport lessons.



Chill's six core values, which are patience, courage, persistence, responsibility, respect and pride, provide kids with a foundation and structure for learning and growth, supported and developed through onboard progression and adult mentorship, as Bornstein explains. All equipment and programming are provided at no cost to participants, he adds.

Transporting kids from underprivileged areas to ski hills filled with sparkling snow and supportive people introduces them to an environment that is a world away from their everyday surroundings. Bornstein shares that program participants are located through social service agencies, foster care programs, mental health agencies, community schools and juvenile justice programs.

Chill Chicago was established in 2001 with the goal of developing a program in the Midwest, and in 2014, they reached out to The Mountain Top at Grand Geneva. The program immediately piqued Grand Geneva's interest, and the first sessions were held in 2015.

"They were looking for a home for their winter sports program in the greater Chicagoland area," Hart says. "We instantly saw it as a great fit into our area and the ski culture we like to support and promote. We are proud to be a community-based ski area. We have always said, 'If you can, you should,' meaning if you have an opportunity and the resources to be a positive part of the community and help support great causes, you should. Chill is a great example of that," Hart says.

Bornstein reflects on Grand Geneva's involvement in the Chill Foundation, saying, "The Grand Geneva staff is incredibly supportive, and they are outstanding teachers and mentors. The mountain itself is the perfect size for beginners while offering plenty of challenges for our youth as they progress as snowboarders. Its proximity to Chicago is also a huge bonus."

#### **CHANGING KIDS' LIVES**

Bornstein says that the Chill Foundation provides kids who are facing significant life challenges with "a safe and inclusive space where they can be themselves, physically removed from their day-to-day realities." Something that can give participants a fresh start, a sense of hope and the chance to discover who they are.

It also invites kids to travel outside their comfort zones into what Bornstein calls "their growth zone." He explains that as participants take on new experiences and work to overcome their challenges and fears, their comfort zones will expand. Their growth zone will eventually be included in their comfort zone, something that's far from what may originally have been their "danger zone."

It just so happens that snowboarding is a perfect activity for those looking to challenge their comfort zones. In fact, the sport is an ideal vehicle for the program's values-based curriculum that weaves in coping mechanisms and socialization skills.

"Snowboarding, and all boardsports, are physically and mentally challenging and they require resilience and persistence every time you get on the board, regardless of how long you've been doing them. It's a great analogy for life — you need to challenge yourself at your own pace, but in order to grow, you need to constantly progress as an individual," Bornstein says.

The bus ride from Chicago to Grand Geneva is treated as "classroom" time in which the program's adult mentors talk about the values and themes of



## "BOARDING" SCHOOL

In cooperation with Burton Snowboards (the same company that is at the helm of the Chill Foundation), Grand Geneva offers the Burton Learn to Ride (LTR) program. Geared toward newbies, the equipment is designed with beginners in mind and is available for kids and adults. It's a progression-focused way to learn that doesn't throw participants in the deep end right away. Instead, it meets people where they are and works seamlessly with their abilities, and that means a lot more fun and easy learning for participants. Chill. For instance, in a video featured on the Chill website, Chicago participants are asked to tear a sheet of paper in half. On one half they're instructed to write the ways they can learn to be responsible during Chill sessions and on the other half ways they can be responsible outside of Chill, at home and beyond.

Hart explains what takes place after the bus arrives at the ski hill. "We have our PSIA (Professional Ski Instructor Association) trained instructors along with the Chill Chicago staff teaching the groups how to ride through a series of lessons that are based on our progression-teaching techniques and using the Burton Learn To Ride system and equipment that we supply."

Hart communicates a similar outlook to the one Bornstein shared on how snowboarding can teach life lessons: "Snowboarding can be like anything new. It's out of most people's norm; it can be intimidating, it can be scary and it can feel at the time like it's an unachievable goal. However, just like everything in life, if you take it one step at a time, look at all challenges in a positive light, work hard and respect the path in front of you, you soon will be shredding the slopes on the hill and ready and confident to take on any challenge in life."

Or, as a second-time Chill Chicago participant puts it, "Chill helped me to keep going and then I got it! I learned some of the tools I need to be successful and positive."

#### STOKED FOR SEASONS TO COME

The Chill Foundation's reach goes well beyond the borders of the United States and Canada, to faraway places where there are kids who also benefit from the program.

In addition to their United States and Canada-based programming, Bornstein says, "There are currently programs in Italy, Austria, Czech Republic and Japan that are affiliated with Burton Snowboards but not included under Chill's umbrella. That will soon change. This consolidation will lead to program

growth in those countries as well as the gradual expansion of Chill programming to new countries in Europe and Asia."

Here in the Lakes Area and in other Chill locations, generous funding spurs on the efforts of the program. Bornstein says, "Chill has thousands of generous individuals and corporate and foundation donors that support our programs through cash and inkind support."

Hart elaborates, saying, "Each location is sponsored by Burton and throughout the year they put on fundraising events to support operations. At Grand Geneva we hold an end-of-season party where a portion of every lift ticket goes to support Chill here."

The 2020 season at Grand Geneva is sure to bring new experiences, along with a range of emotions, to Chill participants as they tackle The Mountain Top's slopes. One thing is for sure: When boarding the bus to return home to

Chicago, they'll take with them more than snowboarding techniques.

If the new season is anything like the others, Hart says, "It will be absolutely heartwarming and inspiring to see the kids' progress." It starts, he explains, "From the very first conversations with them as they express how unsure they are about trying to snowboard; how they've never tried anything like it or they've never seen anything like it close-up. But before you know it, they've completed their last session and they're snowboarding from top to bottom by themselves."

"To see the progression of everyone and to see the self-confidence build and be supported is what it's all about," he adds. "It's amazing to be able to give people the ability to expand their confidence to build their horizons — not only in snowboarding, but in life, and also to give them confidence that they can do and be anything they want to be in life through hard work and determination."



#### **Wedding Cake**

#### **WHAT TO KNOW:**

Plan on choosing your floral designer about eight months from your wedding day. With the help of your planner, you and your floral designer can select a color palette, make note of blooms you love (or hate!) and lay out a proper budget for the arrangements you'll need created. Knowing what styles you like before going into a consultation is very helpful.



#### **QUESTIONS TO ASK:**

- Q: What is your style?
- Q: What is your process?
- Q: Have you worked at my venue before?
- Q: How do items get returned after the wedding? Will you pick up?
- Q: Do you offer rental items vases, trellis, decor—or must they be supplied via a rental company?
- Q: Can my guests take centerpieces home?
- Q: Do you charge for mockup centerpieces before my wedding or is that included?
- Q: How can I stay within my budget without having small bouquets and arrangements?
- **Q:** Dahlias are my favorite kind of flower. Will they be in season for my wedding?

#### **WHAT TO KNOW:**

Plan on hiring your hair and makeup artist team about six to eight months from your wedding date. Does your stylist do bridal updos? Many don't. That's where on-site teams come in. Your beauty vendors will likely only be able to serve one full bridal party per Saturday. So book them sooner rather than later.



#### **QUESTIONS TO ASK:**

- Q: How far in advance should I book my appointment?
- Q: I'd like to book with my bridesmaids. Will you be able to accommodate all of us?
- Q: How much time should I allow for hair and makeup on my wedding day?
- Q: Is there an extra charge for airbrush makeup and/or false eyelashes?
- Q: How much should I expect to spend?
- **Q:** Is a down payment required to book an appointment?
- **Q:** Do you offer consultations and trials?
- **Q:** My hair is fairly thin. Do you offer hair extensions?
- Q: Do you offer onsite services? How far will you travel?
- Q: Can you accommodate sensitive skin?
- **Q:** Do you offer a touch-up kit or touch-up services?

#### WHAT TO KNOW:

Plan to hire a baker six to eight months in advance. Get on their schedule in advance by signing the wedding cake contract. It's likely you'll have your tasting a bit later in the process, but reserving your spot early ensures you get the cake baker you like the best. Before your tasting, research what types of frostings and finishes do best in your style venue.



#### **QUESTIONS TO ASK:**

- **Q:** Are you licensed by the state health department?
- Q: How does delivery work? And what happens if something is damaged on the cake in transit?
- Q: What are the options for cake flavors and fillings? Fondant or Buttercream?
- **Q**: What is your average cost per slice?
- **Q:** Will you design a custom cake or do you have preset styles to choose from?
- **Q**: Is the cake stand provided by you?

# HEALING WINTER SOUPS

Rich with therapeutic foods, these easy-to-make soups will help fight what ails you

oes the photo at right look familar? We all know someone who is bound to come down with the flu or a bad cold this winter. This is the time of year for a good bowl of soup, especially one that can actually make you feel better. The fact is that some soups are extremely therapeutic and can make a difference. On top of that, they are really good tasting. Below, I'll tell you how to make two healing soups — the classic chicken noodle soup and the surprisingly effective curried lentil soup. Both are quick and easy to make, and both will bring a smile to the face of someone who is under the weather.

## THE IMMUNE BOOSTERS AND GERM FIGHTERS

So, what is the science behind all of this? These healing soups are a powerful mucus stimulant that helps clear nasal congestion as well as thin mucus. They also provide liquids which are fundamental in fighting flu and colds. Most importantly, they contain foods that have special healing powers.

Everyone has their favorite healing foods and here are my four favorites for soups. The recipes below incorporate these immune boosters and germ fighters.

- 1. Garlic: A proven antioxidant, antiviral, antibacterial, antifungal, anticancer ingredient. Since ancient times, garlic has been a popular folk remedy for a vast range of ailments, including the common cold and flu. In 1858, Louis Pasteur discovered that bacteria died when exposed to garlic. More recent research has shown that garlic's antibacterial and antiviral activity against infections comes from allicin, a compound found to be present when garlic is crushed or chopped. According to the website healthwithfood.org, it's best to consume garlic when it's crushed, raw or minimally cooked.
- 2. Carrots: We've all heard about the beta carotene in carrots to fight cancer and prevent night blindness, but during flu season, "carrots are helpful in preventing upper respiratory infections and inflammatory lung problems," states the blog "Make Time for Wellness."
- **3.** Onions: According to a variety of researchers, onions aid in ridding the body of viruses. They are one of the best natural sources of quercetin, a bioflavonoid that has shown promising potential for suppressing the rhinoviruses, which are the underlying causes of the common cold.
- **4.** Turmeric: Either alone or in curry powder, this herbal root has numerous health benefits, including antiviral, antibacterial, antifungal, anticancer compounds combined with plenty of antioxidants. Curcumin is the active ingredient.

# THE PLACEBO EFFECT AS A SECRET WEAPON

If someone, perhaps mom, spouse or friend, prescribes soup when you are sick because they say it will make you feel better, this creates an expectation. For something as well-known as chicken noodle soup, the expectation has some credence. A 2016 Harvard University study indicated, "This expectation activates reward pathways in the brain, in turn stimulating the release of



substances called endorphins, which are chemically similar to opiates like morphine. Like morphine, these endorphins bind to opioid receptors and cause pain relief. Therefore, in response to positive expectations of treatment, your brain becomes flooded with its own supply of natural painkillers. ... In fact, placebos are so good at causing pain relief that the placebo effect is stealing the spotlight in recent clinical trials for new pain medications."

# CHICKEN NOODLE SOUP: THE AMERICAN CLASSIC

This recipe for classic Chicken Noodle Soup has some non-traditional twists and some heat, which will stimulate kidney function and make you sweat. It has tons of vitamins and minerals, plenty of protein and is guaranteed to produce some quick improvements in the patient.

The key to this soup is that it has enough red pepper, black pepper and garlic to make the ailing person sweat. It also is surprisingly soothing on the throat. If you are willing to get yourself in motion, you can have this wonderful potion on the table in a little over one hour.

Time Required: About 1 hour Servings: 12-15 (Freeze what you don't use.)

The Gear: Large stockpot

# Ingredients:

- 2 boneless skinless chicken breasts cut into ½" cubes
- 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 2 cups onions diced
- 6 cloves garlic minced or chopped fine
- 1 jalapeño pepper seeded and chopped fine (For a strong cold, try 2 jalapeño peppers.)
- 3 cups carrots coarsely diced or chunked
- 3 cups celery coarsely diced or chunked
- 8 cups chicken stock
- 1, 8 oz. bag spinach.
- 1, 8 oz. pkg. of frozen sweet corn
- ½ lb. egg noodles and no more too many noodles ruin the soup

# Spices:

½ tsp. black pepper

½ tsp. salt

- 2 tsp. crushed red pepper (Feel free to add more.)
- 2 Tbsp. of fresh rosemary chopped
- 2 Tbsp. each oregano, parsley, dill or anything else that sounds good



### Directions:

- Turn the heat to medium high. Add the olive oil to an 8 qt. stockpot and sauté the onions for about three minutes.
- Add the garlic, salt, black pepper, crushed red peppers and the jalapeño; mix well and cook for one minute.
- Pat the chicken with paper towel until dry and add to the pot. Brown the chicken for about four minutes, stirring continually.
- Add the carrots and celery and cook for about 5 minutes until the vegetables soften a little.

- Add the chicken stock, spinach, corn and herbs. Stir well and bring to a boil; turn the heat down and simmer for 20 minutes, covered. (At this point, the soup can be kept in the refrigerator for up to a week until you are ready to serve. Alternately, you can freeze in quart containers and be ready for the onslaught of the flu season. Don't add the noodles until you are ready to serve – they become mushy otherwise.)
- When ready to serve, add the egg noodles, and cook on a simmer for another 10 minutes, covered.
- Add water as needed if the noodles absorb too much liquid.

You can serve the soup with some crusty bread or, my favorite, homemade cornbread. This soup definitely increases body temperature and sweats out the toxins attacking the body – and you can prepare it in only one hour.

# CURRIED LENTIL SOUP: THE INDIAN HEALER

This curried lentil soup recipe introduces the patient to the healing powers of curry powder with its blend of cumin and turmeric. Curry powder also includes a hot element such as paprika or chili powder to stimulate sweating and kidney function, all of which we need to purge the body of toxins.

Lentil soup is one of my favorites. You don't have to soak the lentils, plus you can experiment with ingredients and almost never make a bad batch. And you can prepare the soup in under one hour – just 20 minutes for prep and 40 minutes for cooking.

You can make the soup with any kind of stock: chicken, vegetable, beef or veal. Buy a good quality brand at the supermarket or really have some fun and make your own.

Lentils can be a little bland, which is the major reason to add curry powder — this gives just the right amount of personality. Here's how to make this great soup:

Time Required: Prep 20 minutes, cooking 40 minutes
Servings: 10-12 (Freeze what you don't use.)



# The Gear: Large stockpot

# Ingredients:

- 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 2 Tbsp. curry powder (Penzey's is a great choice.)
- 1 cup celery diced
- 1 cup carrot diced
- 1 cup onion diced
- 1 cup leeks diced
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/4 cup parsley, chopped
- 1 Tbsp. salt
- ½ tsp. pepper
- 1 cup tomatoes, peeled and roughly chopped
- 1 lb. lentils
- 8 cups stock chicken, beef, veal or vegetable

### Directions:

- Dissolve the curry powder in ¼ cup of water and cook in a large pot until it starts to become fragrant and slightly thicker.
- Add the olive oil and butter and stir while the mixture is heating over medium heat.

- Add the onions, leeks, garlic, salt and pepper, stir well to coat with the curry oil mixture and cook for about 4 minutes.
- Add the carrots, celery and parsley; stir well and cook for another 4 minutes.
- Add tomatoes, lentils and stock. Bring to a boil, turn down to a simmer and cook for 30 minutes. Test for doneness and add more cooking time if necessary.
- Test for salt and pepper (you usually need more) and serve.

You can serve the soup with a dollop of crème fraiche. If you can't find crème fraiche, make your own. Buy a six-ounce package of cream cheese and add 3-4 Tbsp. of heavy cream. Stir until you get a nice consistency. Add a little fresh dill, finely chopped, if you really want to get sassy.

You can make an interesting breakfast or even a lunch or dinner by putting the lentil soup, which is really quite thick, over a bed of rice. Top with one or two eggs, made any way and you have an extremely healthy meal.

One of my favorites is to serve it with cornbread on a chilly fall or winter day. I like to break up the cornbread into the soup. This is a great choice for the grandchildren. They generally love this soup if you serve the cornbread with it. Add some hot sauce to really get your day going.

Area doctors share tips to prevent and minimize the effects of influenza

We've all been there. First, there's that pesky tickle in your throat. Then, you wonder if someone is playing with the thermostat, because you're suddenly overheating and just as quickly chilled to the bone. Next, a wave of dizziness and exhaustion forces you to pause for a moment or two or three ...



Finally, you face reality: You've got the flu. The flu isn't a pleasant experience for anyone, but you can take comfort in the fact that you're far from alone. According to the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, during the 2018-2019 flu season (running from Sept. 1 through May 18), there were 17,210 reported cases of the flu statewide. Nationally, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reported between

37 to 43 million flu cases. Wisconsin is comparable to other states.

"Ultimately, people need to be aware that the flu finds its way to just about every state, making it tough to avoid," says Dr. Andrew Morton, family medicine physician at Mercyhealth Hospital and Medical Center–Walworth.



Even though it's "tough to avoid" as Morton says, you can arm yourself with knowledge and learn how to raise your defenses against it.

## **FLU BASICS**

Dr. Javier Gallegos, family care physician at Aurora Health Care

in Lake Geneva, explains why fall and winter are synonymous with flu season. "People are indoors more often during the winter. They are in close contact more often and this promotes transmission from person to person," he says. Another reason he cites is cold temperatures that lead to dry air, "which may dehydrate mucous membranes, preventing the body from effectively defending against respiratory virus infections." In addition, there's a lack of sunlight. "Vitamin D production from ultraviolet B in the skin changes with the seasons and affects the immune system," Gallegos says.

During this time of year, the flu is spread by miniscule droplets created when people cough, sneeze or talk. Gallegos explains, "Once in your body, the flu virus travels through the respiratory tract and binds to cells lining your lungs. They hijack these cells to make more viral particles of their own and spread to other areas."

The benchmark symptoms of the flu include fever, chills, body aches, fatigue, a runny or stuffy nose and a cough or sore throat. These are inconveniences for many of us. For some, they are enough to cause further complications. These can include dehydration and pneumonia. Ear and sinus infections are often seen in children.

The flu can also worsen long-term medical conditions, such as congestive heart failure, asthma or diabetes.

From Sept. 30, 2018, through May 11, 2019, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services reported 126 influenza-associated deaths in the state. Gallegos adds, "Of that total, 85 of those were patients 65 years old and older."

These statistics are enough to make anyone a little nervous, especially since flu is easily contracted. That's why it's imperative to do what you can to protect yourself against the illness.

# PROTECTING YOURSELF

What's the first line of defense against the flu? The flu shot, of course. "It is very important to get a flu vaccine," Morton says. "Not only could you avoid getting the flu but being vaccinated will protect our community by inhibiting spread of the illness."

He notes that it's best to get the vaccine before the flu becomes widespread. Getting vaccinated before the end of October is ideal, but he says that "vaccinating later than that can still be beneficial."

Gallegos agrees with this line of thinking, saying, "Getting vaccinated is the most effective way to ward off the virus, and in the event you still get sick, having the vaccination often makes symptoms much more mild."

In addition to getting a flu shot, there are other ways to fend off the illness, such as covering your mouth while coughing and sneezing, avoiding contact with those who have the flu and frequent handwashing.

Gallegos advises, "Strengthen your immune system by eating well, staying physically active, managing your stress levels and getting enough sleep."

# **HOW TO EASE SYMPTOMS**

Let's say you've done your due diligence and you still end up with the flu. It is possible, but hopefully your preventative measures along with some self-care will lessen the severity of the symptoms.

"Act fast if you begin to show symptoms," Gallegos says. "If you develop a fever, chills, body aches, cough or sore throat, it's a good idea to see your doctor."

"Symptomatic care directed by a clinical professional can help alleviate certain symptoms," Morton adds.

The rule of thumb is that if you're sick, stay home to avoid infecting others. Morton typically recommends the standard care plan of "plenty of rest and fluids."

Medication is an option as well. "Some individuals can benefit from antiviral

medication, but only if it is caught early enough," Morton says. "You should ask your primary care physician if you would be a candidate."

Gallegos also shares thoughts on treating the flu with medication, saying, "Medications work best when taken within 48 hours of symptoms starting. Over-the-counter medications can lower fever and relieve aches and pains, but if you have a higher risk of complications, your doctor may prescribe an antiviral drug to treat the flu."

For most people, the flu lasts from five to seven days. "Flu symptoms usually appear one to four days after being exposed to the virus," Gallegos says. "For people who've had a flu shot, the symptoms may last a shorter amount of time or be less severe."

# AN EVER-CHANGING VIRUS

You might be wondering, "Why are there different strains of the flu? And why do some seasons last longer than others?" Gallegos says, "Flu viruses are constantly changing, which is why the severity of the flu — and the vaccines used to prevent it — are different year to year. Slight genetic changes in viruses over time create different strains and are why people can get the flu more than once. This is also why the flu vaccine must be updated each year to keep up with these evolving viruses."

"Flu viruses are constantly changing, which is why the severity of the flu — and the vaccines used to prevent it — are different year to year."

The virus changes every year, which can make it more difficult for people's immune systems to recognize it and fight it off quickly. "Typically, your immune response is more effective against viruses and bacteria that you've already encountered. The mutations on the flu virus act like a mask allowing

the virus to take hold before it is recognized by your immune system," Morton says.

Although peak flu season runs from December through February, the virus can survive well into spring. Gallegos says, "According to the CDC, the 2018-2019 flu season, at 21 weeks, was the longest flu season in a decade."

The varying length in flu seasons isn't fully understood, but there are some theories. One is tied to temperature. "Generally, cold weather keeps more people indoors and in close proximity with each other and that is at least part of the reason the virus is able to spread so much in the cold months," says Morton. "It may not be until the spring before we start to see fewer cases of influenza."

The moral of the story is that with good lifestyle habits, regular handwashing and an annual flu shot, you just might be able to sidestep this year's wave of influenza.

# Badger High School trains the next generation of restaurant and hospitality leaders BY ANNE MORRISSY

On Tuesday, Sept.17, 2019, Badger High School Family and Consumer Science (FACS) teacher Jamie Lutz and the 10 students in this year's competitive ProStart Culinary 1 and 2 classes gathered around the school's industrial-sized ovens to bake cookies. When they were finished, they had baked 120 dozen — that's 1,440 cookies — in a single day.

delivered them to Alpine Valley Music Theatre in East Troy for Farm Aid 2019, a star-studded benefit concert. "It's a lot of work, this class," explains

The cookies were the result of a wide-reaching community partnership between Badger High School's ProStart Culinary program and the local restaurant and hospitality industry. Former FACS teacher Russ Tronsen started Badger's culinary program 18 years ago as a way to engage the hospitality and tourism industry in the area and create career paths for Badger students. "My background was in food service and hospitality and then I got my teaching certification through UW-Stout," Tronsen says. "I was familiar with the area and I thought it was a great opportunity to start a strong ProStart program." In fact, the program he started at Badger has gone on to become one of the strongest in the state, even earning national awards and accolades.

Now back to those 120 dozen cookies. The weekend after the bake-a-thon this year, the ProStart students



Lutz. "The students in the program do catering events outside of the class – I require three events a semester. For Farm Aid, students could choose from two different shifts. "We were helping the chefs there, serving as an extra set of hands, working to measure and prep food, whatever was needed," Lutz continues.

It's this kind of real-world, handson experience that sets the ProStart Culinary program apart from other high school classes. The rigorous curriculum is drafted by the National Restaurant Association's Educational Foundation with the hope that ProStart students will serve as the next generation of leaders in the restaurant and hospitality industry. It is a popular and influential program. Today, ProStart reaches more than 150,000 students in more than 1,900 high schools across the country.

# STRIVING TO BE THE BEST

The selection process for admission into the program at Badger is difficult and competitive. Lutz and other teachers review applications, including letters of recommendation from community members attesting to the students' work ethic. "We need to make sure that they are ready to commit the time that this program will require, both in school and after school," she explains.

Through the ProStart curriculum, students learn everything from complex culinary skills to proper food storage to restaurant management skills. "Our program is broken into two years," Lutz explains. "Each year they learn about management: how to get employees to get along, how to market your restaurant, how to set up a new restaurant space. And they also learn culinary skills."

Throughout the school year, the Badger ProStart students work toward the ultimate goal of competing in the ProStart Invitational, a statewide competition held in Milwaukee every March. At the competition, teams of five students representing about 25 schools compete in two categories. "For the culinary side of things, the teams get one hour to make an appetizer,

entrée and dessert using only two burners and no electricity," Lutz says. "For the management portion, they have to design a restaurant concept including menu and prices, and present that concept to the judges, who then ask tough questions that a restaurant manager might get in a job interview."

At Badger, the process of preparing for the ProStart Invitational begins in September, when tryouts are held for the five spots on the team. "It's heavily skill based," Lutz explains. "All the students come to tryouts and make the same dish." The results of that single dish determine who makes the team. ProStart team practice begins in the fall and continues throughout the year. By January, the team will be practicing twice a week. By February, three and four times a week. Two weeks before the event in March, the team will be practicing five days a week.

The time and dedication Badger students devote to this preparation frequently pays off. Tronsen says that between 2001 and 2017, the team won the ProStart Invitational state competition in either culinary or management 11 times, more than any other high school in

Wisconsin. A win at the state level earns entry into the national competition in Washington, D.C. Twice, the Badger team went on to win the national title.

"All the ProStart programs in the state have modeled themselves after

Badger," Lutz explains. "At the state competition, everyone has upped their game because of how good Badger is."

## COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Every year as part of the preparation process, Badger team members work with a coach - generally a restaurant and hospitality professional from the community. This year's coach is Nelly Buleje, executive chef at Grand Geneva Resort's nine restaurants and 11 kitchens. Buleje is a Badger alum himself, though he graduated before the ProStart program was implemented. He is excited about the opportunity to coach today's students. "I really want to open up the youth in our community to the industry and the way it's quickly changing," he says. "I want to show students how the changes in the kitchen reflect the changes we see in the world. I want them to understand that although it's hard work and labor intensive, it's still fun."

Lutz, who joined the Badger staff this year after spending 12 years at Westosha High School, says these partnerships with local industry professionals and businesses are the best part about working at Badger High School. "A lot of people think it's just that the [ProStart] program has a really strong curriculum, but Badger is so supportive of everything we want to do as teachers," she says. "And it's not only the school support and administrative support, but the support we've gotten from the community. Everyone I talk to in the industry wants to know how they can help the program."

Part of that community support includes fundraising. Every May, the Ridge Hotel hosts the Burger Throwdown, a charity event in which local chefs from throughout the area compete to be crowned the Burger Champion. Proceeds from the event, which generally sells out weeks in advance, benefit the Badger ProStart Culinary program. "Without the businesses helping us, we wouldn't be able to do half the things we do throughout the year, including buy the latest equipment for our program," Lutz says.

When asked what made him decide to coach the ProStart Culinary team this year, Executive Chef Buleje says the connection between the professional kitchen and the classroom is an important motivator. "I wanted to make a difference in the community and this is one way I hope to leave a lasting legacy."

Lutz says that for her, the hard work is worth it, especially when she sees many of the ProStart students go on to culinary school or hospitality management degree programs. "It's definitely a labor of love," she says. "When the kids actually get to go to the [ProStart Invitational] competition, their eyes are just gleaming. They're interacting with some of the most well-known chefs throughout the state. When they get a compliment on their dish, they're just so excited. Exposing the kids to new ideas and new cooking strategies, letting them have experiences they've never had before...that's what makes this program so successful."
